Speaker Profiles

Natasha Bartolotta

Natasha has been the Communications and Outreach Coordinator for the National Loon Center, Crosslake MN since November, 2021. Natasha migrated all the way from the



Northeast to the Midwest to join the National Loon Center staff.

Bartolotta grew up in New York and Connecticut, and has moved about recently while working a handful of seasonal and temporary research-based jobs. Prior to joining the NLC she worked for Audubon Louisiana as a Coastal Bird Technician to promote community stewardship of beach-nesting birds. Natasha has also worked as a Conservation Educator for the Lehigh Valley Zoo in Pennsylvania and as a research assistant for projects on wild chimpanzees and orangutan behavioral ecology in Uganda and Sumatra, respectively. She had been considering becoming a primatologist but realized she wanted to work on conservation issues closer to home.

In the The Pineandlakes Echo Journal (Brainerd) she described the situation that led to her hiring at the loon center as "fate."

"In July, I came to visit a friend of mine in Brainerd - also from Connecticut," Bartolotta said. "We went kayaking and I saw some loons on the lake, and it reminded me of the job boards I had been scouring, where there was a job with the National Loon Center. I had to go back and look up where in the world Crosslake was, but seeing it was only 25 or 30 minutes away (from Brainerd) was the push I needed to apply."

John Latimer

Minnesota Phenology Network Profile:



As a mail carrier in rural Grand Rapids, Minn., for 35 years, John Latimer put his own stamp on a career that delivered more than letters. Indeed, while driving the hundred-mile round-trip daily route, he passed the time by observing and recording seasonal changes in nature, learning everything he could about the area's weather, plants and animals, and becoming the go-to guy who could answer customers' questions about what they were seeing in the environment.

The expertise he developed along the way turned him into one of Minnesota's leading phenologists and host of a popular weekly radio show on KAXE, that attracts nature lovers and regular phenology contributors from around the state.

His path was a perfect fit for a nature-loving kid who spent his childhood playing in the woods and the ponds outside Grand Rapids. "I was always observing, but not with the careful eye I have now," he says. His forester dad had taught him about trees, and his farm-girl mom knew a lot of the wildflowers, but Latimer found his own way by following his curiosity—and by meeting an elderly customer on his mail route.

"One day, must have been in '82 or '83, she mentioned she'd just seen her first robin of the spring, and it turned out we shared an interest," Latimer says. "From then on, one day a week we'd have coffee and talk, and she got me going."

She bought me my first Stokes field guides."

A year or so later, Latimer found an unexpected outlet for his passion. "One morning a week I volunteered at the local public radio station. I'd tear the feed off the wire, make coffee, play music, talk," he says, rattling off his duties as casually as he might recite a roster of local bird species. "And I started talking about what I saw on the mail route. It was immediately popular. People were tuning in to find out what was going on in nature. I couldn't stop; I found it delightful."

Mike North

Mike North is a 25-year employee of the Minnesota DNR, where he has been involved in environmental review, wetlands protection, and wildlife habitat planning, mostly out of the Brainerd office. Prior to that he was a 10-year employee of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in Alaska, in research, environmental review and endangered species pre-listing work. He has a Bachelor's degree from Iowa State University and a Master's degree from North Dakota State. He is a Master bird-bander and is partnering in research projects with Bemidji State University, the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe, Central Lakes College, the Purple Martin Working Group, the University of Manitoba, and Deep Portage Conservation Reserve. He has been banding birds since 1988 and has banded over 20,000 individuals of some 120 different species. His prize bird is an 11-1/2 year old black-capped chickadee, which holds the record for longest-lived chickadee according to the U.S.'s Bird Banding Lab. His current obnoxious obsession is woodpeckers.

COME JOIN ONE OF OUR MONITORING CLASSES:

- If you just want to learn about bluebirds, this class is for you, no commitment beyond learning.
- We'll learn how to check nest boxes, determine who is using the box by nest type.
- Cover the things we as volunteers need to do to keep bluebirds safe during the nesting period.
- We'll talk about competitor bird species and predators – other birds, mammals, and insects.
- How we record what we find each week and reporting it to BBRP at season end.

From April to August bluebirds and their competitors will be nesting in these boxes. To keep bluebirds safe and record their nesting progress, the boxes need to be monitored on a weekly basis.

From big jobs down to the small jobs - She is an absolute Dear - Just ask anyone who knows her.
P.S. Ardy also keeps house, raised two girls and puts up with me!



Nursing and Raising Baby Birds

In 2010 it rained 7 days straight, I had a lot of 10 day old bluebirds that the mom & dad fed angle worms (easy picking) to hungry chicks. Good food but bad for fecal sacks - they would break and smear the nest and other chicks - what a mess. I found many dead. Some were alive, cold and covered in poop. I gave 57 baby bluebirds like that to Ardy. She cleaned, dried, fed and kept them alive - It was a job! With my records, we did put them into other nests and they all fledged.



Picnic

The Nature Center was a good place, at no cost to us, to have the End of Year Picnic. We had to do it in the late afternoon & evenings. Ardy would go around and ask for donations from local grocery stores, banks and others. She was always there for set-up and clean-up afterwards. Our last picnic in 2021 did not cost too much to do, it is very expensive to rent the same location now. We had no picnic in 2022 due to expenses.

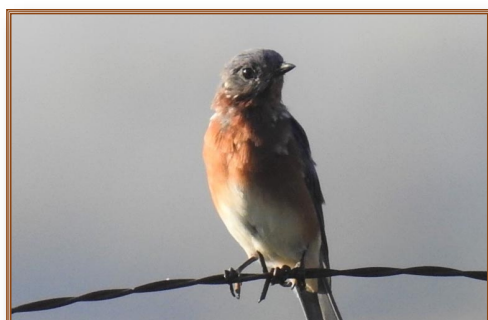
My Records

Ardy has kept my trail records from day one. I do not add other people's birds to my trail totals. Ardy will look up the addresses and report in their name. Some people think I have added these other totals onto mine, but Ardy has taken and kept precise records for all on the trails. We also have all of the Bluebird Newsletters and Directories from 1995 - current date.

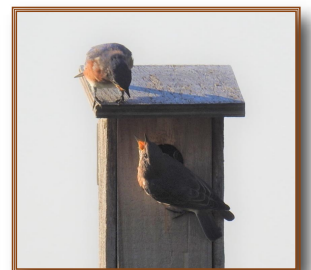
